FEES, STUFF TO BRING, AND DETAILS

FEES: \$100 for both days. Campers may choose our optional lunch on Sat or Sun for \$10 per meal; you may also stay overnight for \$25 per night with all meals included -- see entry form for details.

REQUIREMENTS FOR RIDERS: Open to riders between the ages of 9 and 109. Clinic participants must be able to control their mounts safely and competently at a trot - the equivalent skills of our Yellow Level or higher.



REQUIREMENTS FOR MOUNTS: Mounts should be sound and fit enough for 2 hours of strenuous work in the heat, relatively bombproof, and capable of working around other horses in close quarters without aggression. All participants must ride in English tack. A copy of your current negative Coggins and visual health check required upon arrival. We *may* have a few mounts available to lease for the camp on a first-come-first-served basis.

STABLING: We usually have paddocks available for horses that can stay overnight in a pasture. Call to discuss options.

ATTIRE: Paddock boots (or similar boots) and ASTM-SEI helmets are required. We recommend bringing a change of cooler clothes for the unmounted sessions. Campers

may also bring materials to make costumes for their team's theme (optional); ask us for help designing safe costumes for riding.

MUSIC: Campers will be divided into teams of 2, 3, or 4 riders. Each team will design a routine to music that they have selected.

Campers should bring an mp3 player, iPod, iPhone, or audio CD with tracks that meet these requirements:

- ✓ Each song should last approx 4-6 minutes.
- ✓ Good quadrille music has a strong rhythm; you should be able to imagine yourself riding at a trot and/or walk.
- ✓ If your music has lyrics, they should be "G" rated, with a message that your audience will appreciate and enjoy.
- ✓ If you burn your own CD with a compilation of different songs, copy them with an .mp3 or .cda format.
- ✓ We **MAY** be able to copy your song from your MP3 player - but no guarantees! Bring all accessories for the player, please.

OTHER STUFF TO BRING:

- Sunscreen and rain gear
- Refillable water bottle, snacks and lunch (if you don't do the prepaid boxed lunch deal)
- Overnight campers must bring their own pillows, blankets, and towels.
- PARENTS: don't forget folding chairs and cameras for the show; canopies are allowed only if set up well before the performance.**
